Medium sized trees are better suited for planting in normal city Treebank areas than their larger counterparts. Large trees require more living space, and for this reason it is recommended that they be planted on the private side of the sidewalk whenever possible. The overall objective of proper tree selection is to select the right tree for the right location in order that one may benefit from the tree without being subject to future maintenance liabilities or hazards.
