Watershed-Based Planning

The City of Genoa is participating in a Watershed-based planning process for the Central South Branch of the Kishwaukee River which also includes Deer Creek and the Bull Run Creek near Kirkland. People live, work, and play in their watershed every day. Stakeholder contributions help us to focus on efforts to restore impaired waters and protect unimpaired waters within our community. Watershed-based planning will build awareness of watershed issues through education and stewardship while increasing communication and coordination. This project is being funded through Section 319 of the Clean Water Act Water and is a non-point Water Quality Grant provided through the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The grant is being managed by the DeKalb County Soil and Water Conservation District.

A Goals Workshop is planned for the general public on April 18, 2024 at the Genoa City Hall beginning at 6 pm. The community is encouraged to attend to help establish goals. The workshop will provide the community with information on the background of the watershed and its features. At the workshop you will be asked for help identifying issues that could be addressed through proper planning and implementation of best management practices. A watershed-based map is located on the back of this newsletter for your convenience.
